- a slice of pizza
- a box of chicken wings
- a packet of French fries
- When the food nouns are countable, we add ' $-s^{\prime}$ or '-es' or change ' $-y^{\prime}$ to '-ies' to BOTH the quantifiers and the food nouns in plural forms.
- two slices of pizzas

- three boxes of chicken wings

- four packets of French fries
- When the food nouns are uncountable, we add '-s' or '-es' or change '- $y$ ' to '-ies' to ONLY the quantifiers. to '-ies' in uncountable nouns.
- two bowls of corn
- three cups of lemon tea
- four cups of hot chocolate

We use It to refer to the robot.

We use It to refer to a box of, not chicken wings.
