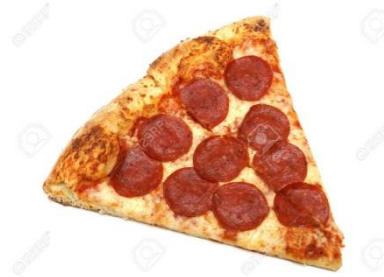

- We use quantifiers to describe some food and drinks.

- a slice of pizza



- a box of chicken wings

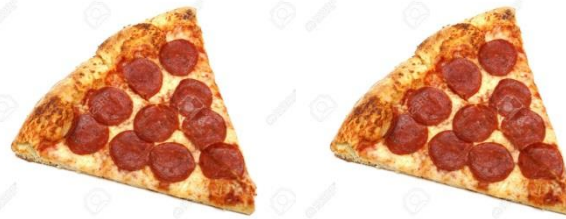


- a packet of French fries



- When the food nouns are **countable**, we add ‘-s’ or ‘-es’ or change ‘-y’ to ‘-ies’ to **BOTH** the **quantifiers** and **the food nouns** in plural forms.

- two slices of pizzas



- three boxes of chicken wings



- four packets of French fries



- When the food nouns are **uncountable**, we add '-s' or '-es' or change '-y' to '-ies' to **ONLY** the **quantifiers**.



Never add '-s', '-es' or change '-y' to '-ies' in uncountable nouns.

- two bowls of corn



- three cups of lemon tea



- four cups of hot chocolate

In this part, you will learn to ask and answer questions about the price of food.

How much

is

an apple pie?
a bowl of corn?

It's

nine dollars fifty.

How much is it?

We can use *How much* to ask about the price of something.



Joe: *How much* is the robot?

Mark: *It's sixty-five dollars.*



We use *It* to refer to the robot.

How much is it?

\$8.50



\$12.80

Bill: How much is a bowl of corn?

Jane: It's eight dollars fifty.

Bill: How much is a box of chicken wings?

Jane: It's twelve dollars eighty.



We use *It* to refer to *a box of*, not *chicken wings*.

Saying prices

Do you know how to say these prices?



eight dollars sixty cents



We can just say **sixty**.



twenty-three dollars fifty



forty-nine dollars thirty

Saying prices



\$65.80

sixty-five dollars eighty



\$82.20

eighty-two dollars twenty



\$117.40

one hundred seventeen
dollars forty

Large, please.

Which do you want, ... or ...?

Marcus is at a fast food shop. Let's see what he is trying to order.

Marcus: **How much** is a bowl of corn?

Cashier: It's **ten dollars**.



What if there are two sizes to choose from?

Which do you want, ... or ...?

When there are two choices, we can use **Which** to ask the question.

Marcus: **How much** is a bowl of corn?

Cashier: **Which** do you want, large **or** small?

Marcus: Small, please.

Cashier: It's **ten dollars**.



We use **or** to link the two choices.



Which do you want, ... or ...?



Marcus: **How much** is a packet of potato chips?

Cashier: **Which** do you want, large **or** small?

Marcus: Large, please.

Cashier: It's **twelve dollars fifty**.

What can we say to order food at a fast food shop?

Vicky: **May I have** a hamburger and **a packet of** French fries, please?

Cashier: Here you go.



I'm still hungry! Can I order more food?

= total cost of food

Cashier: It's thirty-one dollars fifty.

Jimmy: Here you are.

Cashier: Thank you.
