How heavy

We use **How heavy** to ask about weights.



A: This polar bear is the heaviest animal in the zoo.

B: **How heavy** is the polar bear?

A: It's 350 kilograms.

How long

We use **How long** to ask about lengths.



A: The Nile is the longest river in the world.

B: **How long** is the river?

A: It's 6,695 kilometres.

length



✓ It's 6,695 kilometres long.

How tall

We use **How tall** to ask about heights.



A: The International Commerce Centre is the tallest building in Hong Kong.

B: **How tall** is the building?

A: It's 484 metres.

height



✓ It's 484 metres tall.

How high

We can also use **How high** to ask about heights.



A: Angel Falls is the highest waterfall in the world.

B: **How high** is the waterfall?

A: It's **979 metres**.

height



✓ It's 979 metres high.
